Weapons manufacturers play an inordinate role in wars, as do war-profiteering corporations seeking resources (e.g. oil) via wars. Politicians are so influenced by corporate campaign donations that the US is called a corporatocracy. HJR 48, the "We the People Amendment," has nearly 100 co-sponsors in Congress. An easy way to help is to phone Senator Padilla weekly and urge him to introduce a Senate version. HJR 48 will not only reverse the SCOTUS opinion Citizens United v FEC (which gave corporations even more power to bribe politicians), but will also establish that spending money is not equivalent to expressing free speech and that a corporation is not a person and is not entitled to constitutional rights that were intended for human beings. Yes, prior

Supreme Court opinions made those absurdities the law, which is a large part of why we are in such a mess! The amendment process is the only way to reverse SCOTUS decisions.

Overruling those decisions is key to most of what caring progressives want/need because, via corporate "personhood," corporations have more rights than people, so short-sighted greed rules, which has our species on several lemming paths.
